Pre-requisite: None. A laboratory-based high school biology course is the first science course a college-bound student should take. It gives the student an introduction to how living organisms are designed, how they interact with one another, and how they interact with their physical environment. Students are taught how biologists classify life, the chemical processes that make life possible, the structures of RNA and DNA, and the designs of the different cells found in living organisms. Throughout the course, students see that life is the result of design and that organisms have been given the ability to adapt to their surroundings. In addition, they learn various problems associated with the modern evolutionary synthesis. The experiments include extracting DNA from fruit, examining the effects of temperature and pH on enzymes, exploring osmosis and diffusion, building a pedigree, culturing bacteria, growing and examining fungi, and analyzing the structure of a feather. There are also several experiments that explore the microscopic world, including identifying the stages of mitosis, studying live bacteria that were cultured by the student, identifying budding in yeast, and analyzing the microscopic structure of plants and animals. Dissection experiments include: the earthworm, crayfish, fish, and frog.

Pre-requisite: Algebra 1

This course covers fundamental aspects of chemistry such as the classification of matter, atomic structure, spectroscopy, chemical bonding, molecular geometry, physical change, chemical change, stoichiometry, solutions, ideal gases, acid/base chemistry, reduction/oxidation reactions,

thermochemistry, thermodynamics, kinetics, and chemical equilibrium. Weaving together concepts and their mathematical applications, the course teaches students how to think as a chemist, so they can analyze the major changes that occur in matter. Throughout the course, the student is shown how chemistry reveals the amazing design that exists all around us. From the details of atomic structure to the makeup of the very air that we breathe, chemistry shows us the marvelous handiwork of God.

VOCAL ENSEMBLE CLASS

In Middle/High Vocal Ensemble students will learn to sing together and in parts, culminating in at least 2 performances during the school year. At some point in life, you will be asked to deliver a presentation. This class will equip you with the life skills you need to step up to the challenge of public speaking. This public speaking course is designed to meet the student wherever they are in their journey to becoming a competent oral communicator. A controlled and supportive classroom environment with clearly defined roles for speakers AND listeners is the ideal setting for students to learn, practice, and master the techniques of public speaking. Students will be provided with weekly public speaking opportunities ranging from light-hearted low-stakes impromptu speaking challenges to formal speeches lasting 4-7 minutes. Students will also gain the life skill of being active listeners as they learn how to evaluate a speech and provide feedback.

STUDY HALL

Monitored – check out required to leave campus

Note: The Thursday 2:50-4:00 pm Study Hall begins the 3rd week of High School (when the littles start)

Due to our rental agreement with Summitview Church, students must be supervised at all times while attending OliveTree classes. Students must be in a class, in a study hall, or must leave campus. Students are not allowed to roam around the building or be outside during Study Hall or at any time. Students who drive are expected to leave the parking lot in a timely manner. Students must arrive on time to study hall, attendance is taken. Students must obtain permission from the monitor to leave study hall or lunch. Students must study for 60 minutes and are allowed to visit quietly the last 10 minutes of Study Hall.
